JFS Washtenaw County Receives 2 Vital Senior Awards

County is the recipient of two prizes from the Vital Seniors: A Community Innovation Competition. The initiative, the largest of its kind in North America, was designed to catalyze high-impact innovation and create enduring outcomes for vulnerable seniors and their caregivers in Washtenaw County. JFS Washenaw won both the Vital Seniors Innovation Award of \$100,000 for a Large Organization and the Vital Seniors People's Choice Award of \$50,000 for a Large Organization.
