Funding is provided by individuals, corporations, grants, special events and donors who support our mission and bring hope to thousands in need.




Ruth & Norman Rales Jewish Family

Affordable Access to Comprehensive Therapies

- JFS is in the credentialing process and will soon accept most major insurances.
- The majority of our families are in need of financial assistance to help bridge the gap between what they can afford and the true cost of care.
- A large portion of the Center's budget is dedicated to financial assistance, so that no family is turned away.

Equip parents and other caregivers with the necessary information and support to ensure a therapeutic continuum.




Provide the education and guidance needed to build stronger families.

Results from Community Survey of Families with Special Needs


In addition to private insurance, JFS will be offering therapies on a sliding scale. Is cost a factor in your ability to access needed therapies and supports?





Why Now?

- Recent estimates in the United States show 1 in 6 or about 17% of children aged 3 through 17 years— have at least one developmental disability. This is an increase over the prior two reporting periods.
- Locally, the School District of Palm Beach County has reported that 31,700 children in grades K-12 have a developmental or intellectual disability. The pandemic has only compounded challenges and the burden to pay for much-needed therapies is often out of reach for many families.




