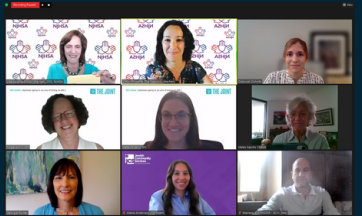




## The Network is:

Working in partnership with other national human service associations and funders, The Network harnesses the collective impact, energy and expertise of its members to address the issues facing the human service sector and gives voice to people in need.

## 2022-23 Impact Report

### Giving **VOICE** to the sector

#### Partnered with **115** organizations/coalitions to address human sector issues, including:

- Crisis response.
- Needs of Holocaust survivors/other older adults with a history of trauma.
- Poverty.
- Refugee resettlement.
- Unemployment/underemployment.
- Youth mental health.

#### With generous funding for key initiatives from:

- The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation.
- Crown Family Philanthropies.
- Jewish Federations of North America.

#### Advocated on the US and Canadian Federal levels for:

- Continued approval by CMS for Medicare coverage for telehealth and an expansion of approved providers.
- Removal of the in-person requirement for Medicare reimbursement of mental health counseling.
- Approval of Work Authorizations for Humanitarian Parolees admitted to the USA and supported with resettlement services by Network member agencies.
- Reauthorization of Medicaid Follows the Person: Home and Community Based Services Supporting Older Adults and Persons with Disabilities.
- Passage of the Canada Disability Benefit Act, a federal program which expands existing provincial disability benefits.

### Serving as an **INNOVATION** hub

#### Projects advanced by the Network Center for Innovation and Research:

- **Portrait of The Network** – analysis of Network agencies for strategic planning, stakeholder education, and advocacy. *Available late 2023.*
- **Climate Action Plan** – plan to mobilize Jewish networks around climate action. The Network is a founding partner of the Jewish Climate Leadership Coalition.
- **Emergency Response Preparedness Toolkit** – roadmap to assist members to develop emergency response plans. *Available late 2023.*
- **PowerNET 2023 Think Tanks** – 300 participants identified solutions to sector-wide challenges.

#### Welcomed **16** new agencies to The Network.

#### Supported **100+** Agencies' Capacity-Building:

##### \$1,577,762 in direct grants

- Project EM employment services.
- Help for SNAP beneficiaries to access employment and training services.
- Reduction of isolation among older adults and support for their caregivers.
- Training for clinicians working with youth in the SPACE model.

- Partnered with **45** vendors to provide discounts on services and products.
